## Pastors' Ponderings for May 2021

First, a tidbit of information (since someone inquired and others may be wondering) about the date of Easter: In the life of the Church this year, we celebrated Easter Sunday on April 4. The date of Easter is determined by the first full moon of spring which follows the spring equinox. The spring equinox is the time when the sun crosses the celestial equator, in the sky above the earth's equator line, and then starts moving to the North. (You can find more information in the *Old Farmer's Almanac* as well as various other places.)

In the Church the Season of Easter (known as The Great Fifty Days) goes from Easter Sunday until Pentecost. It is a season which celebrates Christ's resurrection and new life in Christ. Those days also include Ascension Day, celebrating Christ's Ascension (Luke 24:51) and coming 40 days following Easter Day (including Easter Day).

On May 23, the Church will celebrate Pentecost Sunday which is 50 days after Easter Sunday and is often celebrated as the birthday of the church – that time, as told by the book of Acts, when the Spirit of God called the Church into being. The Season of Pentecost highlights the work and mission of the Church in the world.

Through Global Ministries much of our mission work is done in the world. As their website states "Global Ministries is a common missional witness of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ. Global Ministries works with approximately 290 faith based international partners in close to 90 countries."

As we celebrate Pentecost and enter into the Season of Pentecost, we encourage you to take a look at the Global Ministries website at <a href="www.globalministries.org">www.globalministries.org</a> to learn more about the common mission work of the United Church of Christ and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

#### **Prayer Chain 2.0**

When I was growing up my introduction to the Prayer Chain was a note from my teacher or the Principal at Immanuel Lutheran School folded over for my Mom. Her name was Fay, but in those days she was Mrs. Robert J Lange like all married women. I dutifully handed the notes to her and sometimes they would be about me – or my brother (hopefully). If I was the subject of the note and it was negative, the discussion was one sided and short and the result was quick. No use waiting for my Dad to come home from work. If it was about my brother he usually got off without the quick result of his actions. Sometimes the note wouldn't be about any of the Lange kids. It would be a request for prayers from someone in or outside of our church family. Mom didn't share that kind of information with the kids. Prayer was at bedtime and dinner and not much more for us kids. The Prayer Chain was for adults. You know. The ones that could do real prayers.

Time passed, technology changed, but it still seemed that the Prayer Chain was something women did. They called each other on the phone. Each one had a single person to call and the requests gained steam in a slow serial fashion. It took some time, especially if the ladies got to chatting, but the job got done. Telephone Prayer Chain success.

Then there became the Emailed Prayer Chain. Not a chain at all. "Poof", almost instantly the head lady – it was still a lady thing – could contact everyone on the list and it was done in an instant. But that didn't seem fast enough or wide ranging enough when Social Media came along and dominated many lives. Now it's not just "Poof". It's "Poof" and "Explode". Post a request on Social Media and all your electronic friends can see it and they can share it to people you don't even know and who don't even know the subject of the request, but can become engaged. You can even count how many people have "liked" your request.

Is a little picture of Prayer Hands on Facebook enough? Is a Social Media request for "Prayers" and no hint as to what it's for or who we are being asked to pray for that is somehow omitted enough so a proper prayer can be developed? Don't know. But I do know it is better than not doing anything and relegating prayer back to an occasional meal or bedtime prayer. As I age, the Prayer Chain is more and more important. I might be on it. Oh...I HAVE been on it and am thankful for the chain. The Prayer Chain has changed a lot and will likely continue to evolve, but remain an important part of many lives. But no matter what the changes, I still get most of my Prayer Chain contacts from the ladies of the church. Except for the importance of the prayers themselves, the one thing that has never changed. Thanks ladies.

## Indiana-Kentucky Conference Annual Gathering

The theme for the Indiana-Kentucky Conference Annual Gathering is "From Sackcloth to Joy." There will be worship and wisdom, including a keynote address from the Rev. Dr. Gregory C. Ellison II, from

June 3, 2021-June 5, 2021. Rev. Dr. Ellison is the Associate Professor of Pastoral Care and Counseling at the Candler School of Theology since 2009. His teaching draws primarily from his work with the organization he founded called Fearless Dialogues, a non-profit organization that creates unique spaces for unlikely partners to have hard, heartfelt conversations on taboo subjects like racism, classism, and community violence.

The Gathering will be a virtual meeting and everyone is invited to attend. Registration and additional information will be up on the Ikcucc.org website soon. The registration fee is \$50 per person.

#### Who We Are

The United Church of Christ (UCC) is a distinct and diverse community of Christians that come together as one church to join faith and action. With over 5,000 churches and nearly one million members, across the United States, the UCC serves God in the co-creation of a just and sustainable world.

The United Church of Christ is the only Protestant denomination that was formed from four separate Protestant denominations. In 1931 the Congregational Churches and the Christian Churches merged. The Evangelical Church and the Reformed Church merged in 1934. St. John's was founded as the German Evangelical Church of Vincennes. It later became St. John's Evangelical Church and then St. John's Evangelical and Reform Church. In 1957 The Congregational Christian Churches and the Evangelical and Reformed Church merged to form the United Church of Christ and St. John's became St. John's United Church of Christ.

## Summer Church Camp 2021

Merom Camp and Conference Center is related to the Indiana-Kentucky Conference. The Camp sits on a bluff overlooking the Wabash River in beautiful Sullivan County. For decades young people have been attending Church Camp under the supervision of volunteer directors and counselors. The Staff at Merom works very hard to provide a safe and comfortable environment where young people can learn about God and Jesus, make new

friends and create great memories.


#### Please rescue me!
